Location of Chiltern Open Air Museum, Newland Park, Gorelands Lane, Chalfont St Giles, HP8 4AB



The museum is close to the M25 at Junction 17. **From June 2009 to May 2010 follow the signs to Maple Cross and then follow diversion signs in place on A412 which will take you through Chalfont St Peter back onto Gorelands Lane. From there follow the brown tourist signs to the Museum.**

The museum is also signposted from the A413 at Chalfont St Peter and Chalfont St Giles.

The nearest train stations are Chalfont & Latimer or Chorleywood stations (both are on the Chiltern Line from Marylebone Station and the Metropolitan Line from Baker Street Tube Station). There are taxi ranks at both stations.

There is plenty of car parking available at the museum.
